Sossusvlei

Area Overview

Star dunes with up to five crests rise 300m into the air and rank among the biggest in the world; the dune valleys are marked by vast clay pans where the Tsauchab River gave up its fight to reach the

sea more than 60,000 years ago.

Besides the dunes and pans of Sossusvlei and Sesriem Canyon, a sideshow of activities and sights has developed around the region and there are plenty of game lodges that provide additional desert-adapted activities. Plants and birds are the dominant life form in this dessicated realm and they support a tiny world of mammals, reptiles and insects that, in the absence of coastal fog, seldom wander far from the rivercourse and its pans.

Area Overview

Surrounded by the ancient Namib Desert and the inhospitable - but bounteous - Atlantic Ocean, Swakopmund is alive with activity and has a lot on offer for the adventure-seeker.

Half way between Namibia's top two attractions, Swakopmund makes for an ideal break to the vast distance between Sossusvlei and Etosha. Swakop's an unusual place. Poking out amidst palm trees are Bavarian spires and there's a lighthouse dating back to 1902. In fact, there's a very German feel to it all, with colonial buildings, German style restaurants and coffee shops selling German cakes. Add to that lots of restaurants, bars, a museum and a small aquarium and you get a bustling town popular with both tourists and Namibians.

And Swakopmund is more than just a quaint coastal town on the Skeleton Coast, it is the adventure centre of Namibia. Desert tours, sea kayaking and scenic flights are complimented by a host of adventure activities including quad biking, paragliding, sandboarding and skydiving. Certainly one of the best, and most unusual, places to visit in Namibia.

Welcome to Damaraland

Area Overview

Damaraland features vast khaki plains, sheer rocky mountains and incredible desert-adapted wildlife. Track rhino and desert elephant, explore the rugged land or sit back and enjoy the dramatic and endless scenery. Damaraland's hilly savannah supports a large number of species including lion, leopard, cheetah, hyena, eland, kudu, giraffe, klipspringer, steenbok, gemsbok and springbok. Birdlife is prolific with over 33 raptors recorded including cuckoo hawks, Egyptian vultures and peregrine falcons - the world's fastest animal.

Damaraland is divided into several enormous private game reserves, known as concessions, that support most species of Namibia's large game and provide some of the best birding and wildlife experiences in the country - and southern Africa for that matter.

Damaraland has many **geological and historical attractions**. Giant inselbergs, formed millions of years ago, rise sheer and jagged from the barren plains of the inner Namib Desert. Explore Brandberg - which, in addition to being the highest peak in the country, has the allure of ancient rock paintings and the intriguing White Lady of Brandberg. Explore Burnt Mountain, Organ Pipes, Doros and Messum Craters as well as the 280 million year old trees of the Petrified Forest. At Twyfelfontein discover Southern Africa's finest prehistoric rock art and engravings.

Day 6 - 7

Swakopmund – Damaraland 325km - approximately 4 to 5 hours

- After breakfast you can make your way to the reception area of the property as this is where you will meet your guide as your guided adventure starts from here.
- Head north along the Skeleton Coast, via Henties Bay to visit the Cape Cross seal colony. Along the way, stop at the Lichen Fields as well as the ship wreck between the colourful small town of Wlotskasbaken and Henties Bay
- Backtrack to Henties Bay and head inland through wide open plains to Uis, then north to the Twyfelfontein area
- Your guide will take you to visit to Namibia's Open Air Museum, the Twyfelfontein Rock Engravings as well as the interesting Organ Pipes rock formations and Burnt Mountain
- Go on a nature drive with your guide to search for the desert-adapted elephants
- Visit the Damara Living Museum for a hint of culture

Mowani Mountain Camp is a sanctuary set within the stunning landscapes of Damaraland. Dwarfed by massive ochre boulders, the camp blends into the landscape so that every soft curve or ragged edge frames the landscape differently, as if you are seeing it for the first time, every time.

Mowani offers a variety of immersive experiences, starting with a Guided Nature Drive, which gives guests the opportunity to explore the surrounding landscape in search of wildlife, including the extraordinary desert-adapted elephants, with drinks and snacks provided. They can also embark on a two-hour journey to the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Twyfelfontein to view ancient rock engravings and marvel at the geological formations of Burnt Mountain and the Organ Pipes. For an even more immersive experience, guests can visit the Damara Living Museum, which offers a unique opportunity to experience the traditional culture of the Damara people. Additionally, visitors have the option of a Self-Guided Nature Walk along a marked trail featuring information on local flora, or they can request a local guide for a more extended nature walk experience.

Etosha South

Area Overview

Located just south of the boundary of Etosha National Park in northwestern Namibia, Etosha South makes up the southern region of this wild paradise. The area is comprised of a collection of world class private game reserves. The national park can be accessed via the southern entrance at Andersson's Gate. Visitors can catch a glimpse of a variety of wildlife including: lion, giraffe, elephant, white and black rhino, and a multitude of plains game. Popular activities include: enjoying an open 4x4 safari with an expert guide, half day or full day drives with the option of a picnic lunch with wine on the full day game drive.

Day 8 - 9

Damaraland - Etosha South 320km approx. 3 to 4 hours

- After breakfast, drive east towards Khorixas stopping at the Petrified Forest en-route
- From Khorixas head further east along the tar road to Outjo and then north to your lodge which is situated very close to the southern entrance of Etosha, the Anderson Gate

- If time permits, enter Etosha for an afternoon game drive. Depending on how often you stop today, you should arrive at your lodge in time for lunch
- On entering the park, the first stop would be Okaukuejo where you pay your entry fee (included) and I suggest you pop in at the local shop to purchase some drinks and snacks and most importantly, a map of Etosha which will show you all the waterholes along the way
- Etosha is one of Africa's great game parks. With 114 species of mammal and 340 species of birds you are sure to see a great variety of wildlife on your safari

Check in at Ongava Lodge

Standard Chalet x 1 (Full Board)

1 Night

Property Overview

The well-established Ongava Lodge is situated in the privately owned Ongava Game Reserve along the southern boundary of Etosha National Park. Placed as it is close to the top of a hill in the foothills of the Ondundozonanandana range, the vantage point is beautiful and overlooks a well-frequented waterhole and the plains beyond.

Ongava Lodge offers luxury accommodation in 14 rock-and-thatch en-suite chalets. There are impressive views over the camp's waterhole from the main lounge and dining areas and there is also an inviting pool to cool off in the heat of the day. Meals are either served in the main dining area under thatch or on the dining deck under the stars.

Experience & Activities

Activities include game drives into Etosha, spending time in the camp hide, and nature drives and walks on the reserve. Ongava has resident white and black rhino, giving guests staying at Ongava the opportunity to see both species.

Welcome to Etosha East

Area Overview

On the eastern edge of Etosha National Park, the park itself is bordered by numerous private reserves and access into the park is via the Von Lindequist Gate, named after Dr. Friedrich von Lindequist who proclaimed it a game reserve in March 1907. This side of the park is characterised by flat endless plains, tree-savanna type of vegetation and fantastic waterholes, where you could easily spot any of the prolific wildlife Etosha is known for. There's an abundance of wildlife here.

Day 9 - 10

Etosha (south) – Etosha (east) a full day's game drive through the park

- From one side to the other side of the park is a full day game drive as you head slowly east stopping at numerous waterholes along the way
- Take a slow drive in the morning and then enjoy a packed lunch (optional extra) overlooking one of the waterholes before continuing on through the park to the eastern side
- 1 full day is set aside for game viewing, either all day or alternate with morning and afternoon guided drives

Check in at Onguma The Fort

Bush Suites (Half Board)

2 Nights

Property Overview

The Fort is unlike any other, the only one of its kind in Namibia. It is built in exactly the right spot to give guests probably one of the best sunset views in the whole of Namibia – overlooking the beautiful scarceness of the Etosha Pans, decorated only with its wild animals and hundreds of camel thorn trees.

Upon arriving at The Fort, guests will be received by not only friendly staff, but also massive raw walls, stunning stone cladded features and a huge tower with views toward Etosha and Fisher's Pan. 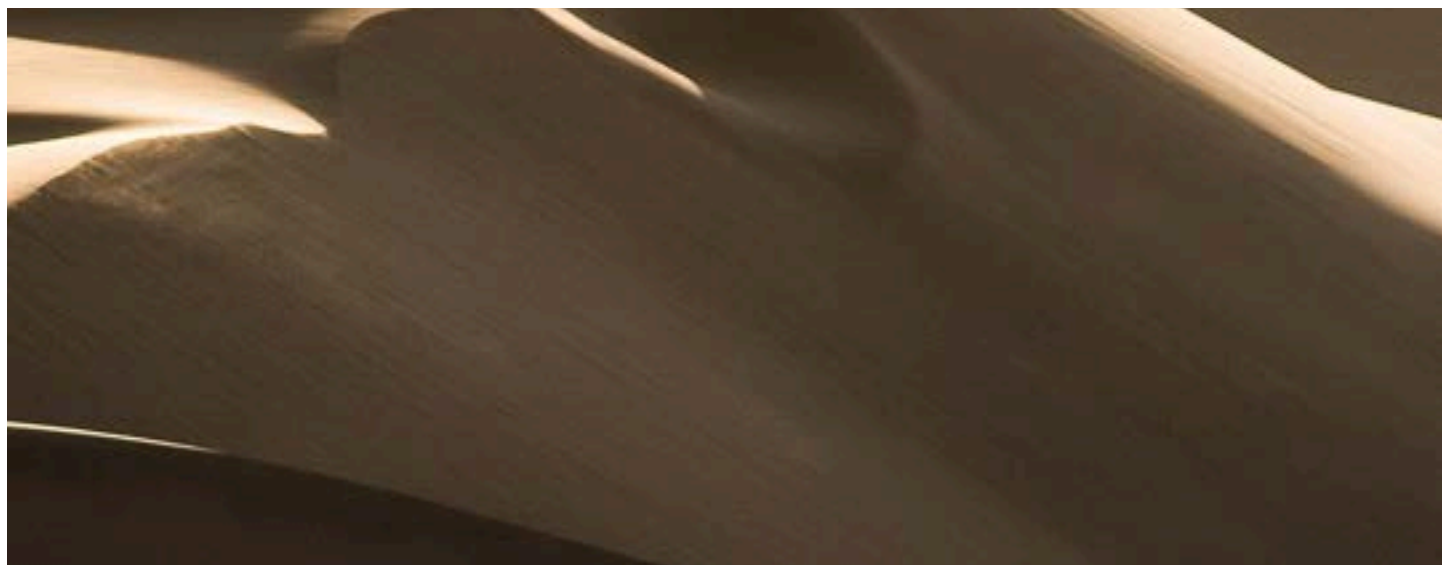
